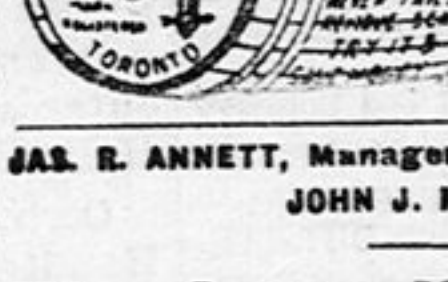

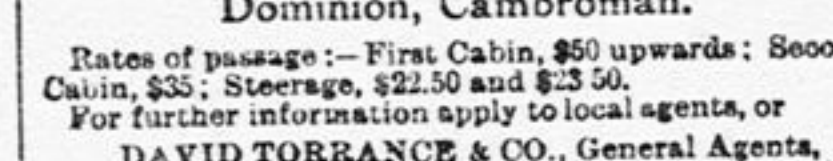

As announced some time ago, the
appointment of Mr. A. G. Ramsay from
the offices of President and General
