

EDITORIAL NOTES.

During the century now closing nearly 30,000,000 Europeans have sought new homes in foreign lands. The greater part of this vast migration has occurred within the past fifty years; and simultaneously a great outward movement of the Chinese has taken place.

Fifty years ago scarcely one hundred thousand Chinese were living outside of their own country. Thirty years ago the number living in other countries of Asia was estimated at 2,500,000. Ten years ago the figures had increased to 6,000,000.

Wherever they go in Asia, they are as in this country, industrious and law abiding, always quite distinct from the rest of the population, and preserving the customs of their native land.

Another significant fact is the large movement of Chinese which has been in progress for some years, to other parts of their own empire, particularly to Manchuria and Mongolia, where they have carried not only enterprise, but wealth, and are developing trade to their own advantage.

SOME GOOD VEGETABLES.

Some of the most desirable garden vegetables are neglected by most farmers and many village gardeners. Spinach should be planted either in the fall or the first thing in the spring, then it will come in when other greens are scarce.

Cauliflower is another neglected vegetable. It is almost as easily grown as cabbage. It requires about the same treatment and in many respects is even more desirable.

No garden is complete without a good supply of celery. Sow a few seeds in a hot-bed or in boxes in the house, then in July transplant to rows in the garden.

A few plants of Brussels sprouts will be found quite an addition, and as these are a kind of cabbage, the treatment is the same as for cabbage or cauliflower.

One of the very best and least known garden plants is salsify or vegetable oyster. This is very hardy and is as easily grown as parsnips.

CARE OF MILK, AND CHURNING. As soon as drawn from the cow, put the milk where no bad odors can reach it, or better, so soon as a pail is filled strain it into the can and place in a tank of cold water or run through the separator if one is used.

Change the water in the tank often enough to prevent its becoming foul. If the water is kept at about 55 degrees, practically all the cream will rise in 24 hours.

FATTENING STOCK ECONOMICALLY. Not every farmer can fatten an animal economically, writes G. W. Harlacher. The ability to do this must be acquired by study and practice.
