difficulty in all subsequent operations on the crop and meagre returns. In all our "hoed" crops we should not neglect to cultivate if possible after each rain, no matter how often, as soon as the land is sufficiently dry. This will keep the land from caking and will retain the moisture near the surface. Such cultivation, which should be shallow, will also be the most fatal to weeds. It is a great mistake to let the enemy appear well in evidence and become thoroughly mobilized before commencing the inevitable battle.

PIGS ENRICH A DAIRY FARM. One object in keeping swine on the dairy farm is the making of manure. Where the dairy is an average sized one, and especially where there is milk the year around, the keeping of swine can be made fairly profitable. The farmer thus situated should keep one or more breeding sows, at least enough tem. to raise a sufficient number of pigs for his own use. Have them ready for the market at six or eight months.

These are the kind most generally wanted, and to supply the demand it is necessary to keep the animals thrifty and growing from the first, and to secure the most profitable results it will be necessary to feed and care for them in the most approved manner. They must be kept warm and dry in cold weather and comfortable at all In winter this means good quarters and plenty of bedding. 
