NOAH WENGER DEAD

Mr. Noah Wenger of Ayton died on Saturday night last. His remains were to have been interred early yesterday, but owing to the blockade relations had to drive from Guelph and in consequence the funeral had to be postponed. To gain an insight into the history of the Wenger family, one has to go back a good many years to the date when Mr. Isaac Wenger, who had been conducting a large general store business in the village of Elmira, removed with his family to Ayton and established an extensive business which he carried on to his death. He was succeeded by his sons Noah, Aaron and Amos. Mr. Amos Wenger, who looked after the mill business, died several years ago, since which time the mill has been conducted by Mr. Noah Wenger and brother. Mr. Aaron Wenger has conducted the general store, retaining the old name of "Isaac Wenger."

The late Mr. Noah Wenger was a benevolent, large-hearted man and in every respect a good citizen. There was no one in the community in which he resided who enjoyed to a fuller extent the confidence and esteem of the people, and never was that trust betrayed. At the time of his death Mr. Wenger was treasurer of the township of Normanby. He leaves a widow and several children. His children have been particularly clever children and the father took great pains in affording them every opportunity of obtaining a good education. Mr. Wenger's name had been frequently mentioned in connection with one or another public office or position, but he was of a retiring disposition and office never had the charm for him equal to that of his ain fireside.—Hanover Post.

DEATH OF FATHER STEWART.

He was taken up to Heaven by an angel early in the morning of Feb. 1, and is now up yonder wearing the Crown of Glory. He lived in Durham for over 55 years, coming to Canada when but a young boy. He landed in Quebec a stranger where he worked a short time before going to the Wilderness of Norfolk. Father Stewart was twice a pioneer. Leaving Norfolk in Sept. 1849 he came by way of Fergus, where the writer first met him, and we travelled together two days as far as Smith's Hotel in Egrement. I left him there and he told me when I got to Durham to call at John Brown's shanty on the banks of the Saugeen and tell them he would be there Monday night to preach. Little did I think then that that man was sent up to Grey and Bruce to preach Christ and Him crucified.

Father Stewart did not come here in broadcloth and kid gloves—just the plain homespun, which was the right kind of cloth for travelling over brush and logs. His wants were so very great at times that he had to sell his cow or horse, but for all this when he would sit down to his scanty meal he would never forget to thank the Lord. Assistance was sometimes sent him from Christian men in Toronto, whom it seems had sent him here as a missionary. The present generation will hardly believe me when I tell them he travelled all over Grey and Bruce for no other purpose than to fulfil the work that God sent him to do. Yes, dear friends, he did it, he finished his course and is now up yonder wearing the Crown that many are wearing.

Father Stewart had one son who is now one of the leading ministers in Rochester, and whom I trust like his father, is leading those Americans to God. While travelling through Bruce he made his home at the writers, and if the writer were an expert he would write one of the greatest histories of that old pioneer minister—a man whose life and works shall never be forgotten.—Hanover Post.
