In no instance should an animal be killed immediately after a long drive or after a rapid run about the pasture The flesh of an animal that has been overheated is usually of a pale colour and very often develops a sour or putrid odor within three or four days after being dressed. Bruises cause blood to settle in that portion of the body affected, presenting an uninviting appearance, and often cause the loss of a considerad!e portion of the carcass.
