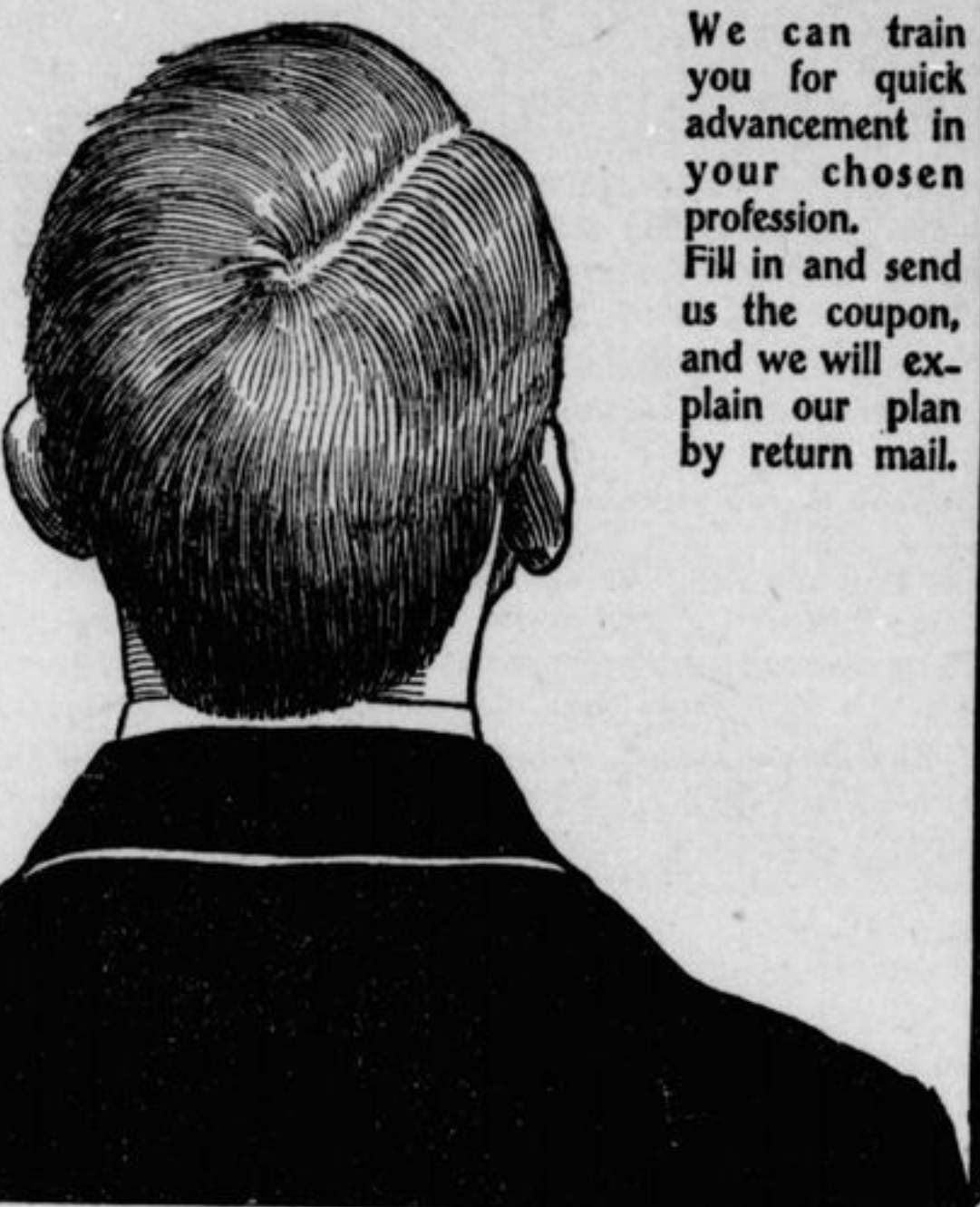

A meeting of the Directors of East Grey Agricultural Society was held in the town hall on Monday at which the date formerly set for the Fair—Sept 27 and 28—was confirmed and revision of prize list took place. In some lines notably horses and cattle the list has been enlarged and prizes increased. In poultry some weeding out is to be done and new and more profitable breeds added. In ladies work the entries are to be limited which will to some extent curtail the so called "farming" of the fair done by some. A new departure is added to the list "noxious weeds," named for which prizes are to be given for the best collections. This is to be educative by bringing to the notice of the farmers weeds which, perhaps, they are ignorant of either as to their presence or destructive nature. A resolution was adopted again favoring the employment of expert Government judges for stock if circuit can be arranged for.

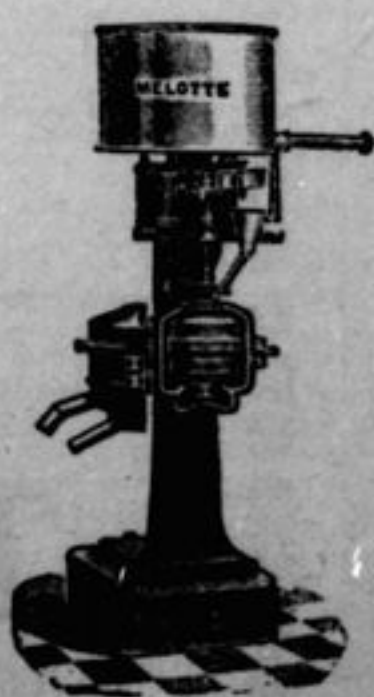
