The poultice in this case is made of the raw onion pounded to a pulp and bandaged state for the exalted duty of codifying around the throat well up to the ears, changing as often as the mass becomes dry. A poultice of the same on the sole of each foot reduces the fever. The flamed mucous membrane and therefore acceptable in case of whooping cough, croup or diphtheria. An excellent way to make the sirup is to cut the onion into slices, sprinkle plentiful-I with sugar and press between hot tes and a heavy weight until all the i. ce is extracted.
