This we trust will be universally done by a grateful people throughout our fair Dominion on the day set apart for our National Thanksgiving. The usual union service here will be held in the Methodist church at 11 a. m. when Rev. G. F. Harlbert will preach the Thanksgiving sermon.

In the Presbyterian church the pastor's subject was the Schemes of the church and the discourse contained much information respecting the missionary work of the church. Envelopes were distributed for the congregation's annual contribution.

At the regular weekly meeting of the Christian Endeavor in the Presbyterian church on Thursday evening last ten new members were received and added to the roll which shows the Society to be in a prosperous condition. Mr. Herb Smith was elected President in the place of Rev. Mr. Thom, who resigned to make room for other talent. Mrs. Smith Miss Crossley, delegates to the Convention at Shelburn last week, gave their report which was interesting.

The funeral took place on Monday at Salem cemetery on the farm occupied by the deceased and his brothers for many years.
