

**MUNICIPAL By-Law No. 477.**

**Of the Municipal Corporation of the Town of Durham.**

A By-law to provide for the payment off of the existing floating indebtedness (exclusive of Debenture indebtedness) of the Town of Durham, and to authorize the issue of Debentures of the said Town of Durham to the amount of \$4500. for the purpose of raising the sum required therefor.

WHEREAS in estimating the probable cost of certain public works or improvements in the Town of Durham, not included in any local improvement By-law therefore, certain of the cost thereof had been overlooked or underestimated, by the Council of the said Town of Durham, and it became necessary for the said Council temporarily to borrow the money required to pay for the said public works or improvements from the Standard Bank of Canada, in the Town of Durham, which debt to said Bank it is intended to pay off of the proceeds of the Debentures to be issued under this By-law.

AND WHEREAS it is deemed advisable that the said Municipal Corporation of the Town of Durham, should pay off and satisfy the debt so due or owing to the said Standard Bank of Canada, which amounts to the sum of \$4500. thereabouts.

AND WHEREAS in order thereto it will be necessary to issue Debentures of the said Municipality for the sum of \$4500. as hereinafter provided, the amount of the debt to be created by this By-law proceeds of the said Debentures to be applied to the purpose aforesaid to no other.

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to issue said Debentures at one time to make the principal of the Debentures repayable by years during the period of twenty years, being the currency of the Debentures; said yearly sum of such respective amount to the aggregate amount payable each year for principal and interest in respect of the said debt to be as nearly as possible equal to the amount so payable in each of the other nineteen years of the period (as shown in Schedule "A" annexed).

AND WHEREAS the total amount required by "The Municipal Act" to be annually by special rate for the said debt and interest as hereafter provided is \$345.94.

WHEREAS the amount of the rateable property of the Town of Durham, according to the latest Assessment roll thereof is \$300.

WHEREAS the amount of the existing Debenture debt of the Municipality is \$48,078.00, no sum either of principal or interest is in arrear.

BEFORE the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Durham, enacts as follows:

The Municipal Council of the Town of Durham, shall expend of \$4500.00 in paying off the floating indebtedness of the Town of Durham, (exclusive of Debenture indebtedness) and for the purpose of raising the said sum, Debentures of the said Town of Durham to the amount of \$4500.00 as aforesaid in not less than \$100.00 each shall be issued on the day of January 1, 1905, each of which shall be dated on the date thereof, and shall be payable in twenty years thereafter to the Standard Bank of Canada at the Town of Durham.

The said Debentures shall be issued by the Mayor of the Town of Durham, and by the Clerk of the said Town of Durham, shall at the Corporate Seal of the said Town of Durham.

The said Debentures shall bear interest at the rate of 4 1/2 per centum payable yearly at the day of January 1st every year during the term thereof, and shall have interest coupons for payment of interest, which coupons shall be issued by the Mayor of the said Town of Durham.

The currency of the said Debentures shall be raised by the said Town of Durham on all the said Debentures to the amount of \$4500.00 for the said Debentures in respect of the said Debentures as shown in the Schedule "A" annexed.

The said By-law shall take effect on the day of January 1, 1905.

(6) The vote of the Electors of the said town of Durham, shall be taken on this By-law at the following times and places, that is to say:—

ON MONDAY THE 2ND DAY OF JANUARY A. D. 1905.

Commencing at the hour of nine o'clock in the forenoon and continuing till five o'clock in the afternoon of the same day by the following Deputy Returning Officers:—

At A. Davidson's office by Clifton Elvidge, D. R. O.

At the Town Hall by H. H. Mockler, D. R. O.

At S. P. Saunders shop by John Smith, D. R. O.

(7) On Saturday the 30th day of December A. D. 1904 the Mayor of the said Town of Durham shall attend at the Clerk's office in the Town of Durham, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to appoint persons to attend at the various polling places aforesaid, and at the final summing up of the votes by the Clerk on behalf of the persons interested in and promoting or opposing the passing of this By-law respectively.

(8) The Clerk of the Council of the said Town of Durham, shall attend at his office in the said Town of Durham at ten o'clock in the forenoon of Tuesday the 3rd day of January A. D. 1905, to sum up the number of votes for and against this By-law.

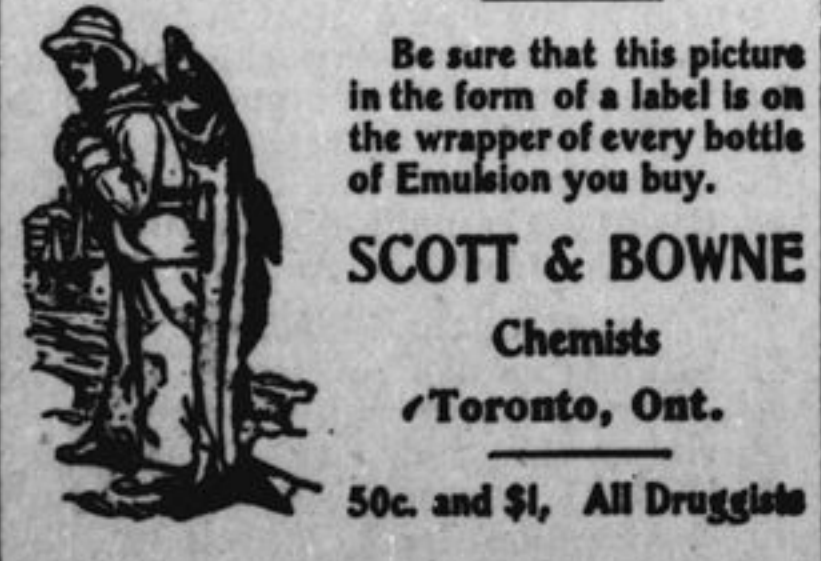
