By-Law No. 477.
Of the Municipal Corporation of the Town of Durham.

A By-law to provide for the payment off of the existing floating indebtedness (exclusive of Debenture indebtedness) of the Town of Durham, and to authorize the issue of Debentures of the said Town of Durham, to the amount of \$4500. for the purpose of raising the sum required therefor.

WHEREAS in estimating the probable cost of certain public works or improvements in the Town of Durham, and not included in any local improvement By-law therefore; certain of the cost thereof had been overlooked or underestimated by the Council of the said Town of Durham, and it became necessary for the said Council temporarily to borrow the money required to pay for the said public works or improvements from the Standard Bank of Canada, in the said town of Durham, which debt to the said Bank it is intended to pay off out of the proceeds of the Debentures to be issued under this By-law.

AND WHEREAS it is deemed advisable that the said Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Durham, should pay off and satisfy the debt so due or owing to the said Standard Bank of Canada, which debt amounts to the sum of \$4500.00 or thereabouts.

AND WHEREAS in order thereto it will be necessary to issue Debentures of the said Municipality for the sum of \$4500.00 as hereinafter provided (which is the amount of the debt intended to be created by this By-law) the proceeds of the said Debentures to be applied to the purpose aforesaid and to no other.

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to issue the said Debentures at one time, and to make the principal of the said Debentures repayable by yearly sums during the period of twenty years, being the currency of the said Debentures; said yearly sums being of such respective amounts that the aggregate amount payable in each year for principal and interest in respect of the said debt shall be as nearly as possible equal to the amount so payable in each of the other nineteen years of the said period (as shown in Schedule "A" hereto annexed).

AND WHEREAS the total amount required by "The Municipal Act" to be raised annually by special rate for paying the said debt and interest as hereinafter provided is \$345.94.

AND WHEREAS the amount of the whole rateable property of the Town of Durham, according to the last revised Assessment roll thereof is \$601,183.00.

AND WHEREAS the amount of the existing Debenture debt of the said Municipality is \$48,078.01 whereof no sum either of principal or interest is in arrear.

THEREFORE the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Durham, enacts as follows:—

(1) The Municipal Council of the said Town of Durham, shall expend the sum of \$4500.00 in paying off the existing floating indebtedness of the Town of Durham, (exclusive of Debenture indebtedness) and for the purpose of raising the said sum, Debentures of the said Town to the amount of \$4500.00 as aforesaid in sums of not less than \$100.00 each shall be issued on the day of January A. D. 1905, each of which Debentures shall be dated on the date of the issue thereof, and shall be payable within twenty years thereafter at the Standard Bank of Canada at the said Town of Durham.

(2) Each of the said Debentures shall be signed by the Mayor of the said Town of Durham, and by the Treasurer thereof, and the Clerk of the said Town of Durham, shall attach thereto the Corporate Seal of the Municipality.

(3) The said Debentures shall bear interest at the rate of 4 1/2 per centum per annum, payable yearly at the said Bank, on the day of January in each and every year during the currency thereof, and shall have attached to them coupons for payment of the said interest, which coupons shall be signed by the Mayor and Treasurer of the said Town of Durham.

(4) During the currency of the said Debentures there shall be raised annually by special rate on all the rateable property in the said Town of Durham, the sum of \$345.94 for the purpose of paying the amount due in each of the said years for principal and interest in respect of the said debt as shown in the Schedule "A" hereto annexed.

(5) This By-law shall take effect on the day of January A. D. 1905.

(6) The votes of the Electors of the said town of Durham, shall be taken on this By-law at the following times and places, that is to say:—
 ON MONDAY THE 2ND DAY OF JANUARY A. D. 1905.

Commencing at the hour of nine o'clock in the forenoon and continuing till five o'clock in the afternoon of the same day by the following Deputy Returning Officers:—

- At A. Davidson's office by Clifton Elvidge, D. R. O.
- At the Town Hall by H. H. Mockler, D. R. O.,
- At S. P. Saunders shop by John Smith, D. R. O.

(7) On Saturday the 30th day of December A. D. 1904 the Mayor of the said Town of Durham shall attend at the Clerk's office in the Town of Durham, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to appoint persons to attend at the various polling places aforesaid, and at the final summing up of the votes by the Clerk on behalf of the persons interested in and promoting or opposing the passing of this By-law respectively.

(8) The Clerk of the Council of the said Town of Durham, shall attend at his office in the said Town of Durham at ten o'clock in the forenoon of Tuesday the 3rd day of January A. D. 1905, to sum up the number of votes for and against this By-law.

SANCTUM SIFTINGS.

The party followers of Mr. Rosseven go so far as to find fault with Conservatives who supported the Referendum charging them with the motive of doing so "to put Ross in the hole." Granted for the sake of argument that even some of them did do so, was it not a measure introduced by Mr. Ross himself, who during the campaign told his temperance friends that he had supported every scheme for the advancement of temperance, and that he would support the Referendum Was it a crime for Conservatives to vote in support of a scheme that was submitted by Mr. Ross?
