### WHAT ARE YOU DRINKING?

(Toronto Star.)

The adulteration of liquors is an evil that Governments are sure to deal with as knowledge of the matter is gained. In the presence of members of the Agricultural Bureau of Chemistry at Washington, says that 85% of the whiskey sold over the bar in the U. S. is adulterated. In a dozen cities across the line the pure food investigators have discovered that whiskey is dangerously adulterated with wood alcohol. This is a poison. Two ounces of it absorbed into the system by a person not prepared for it by gradual use will cause death or total blindness. Whiskey adulterated with wood alcohol will have a bad effect on the eye sight of those who use it, even if not used to excess.

In Canada we are taking altogether too much for granted, and it is about time that chemists in the employ of the State were set seriously to work analyzing the prepared foods and drinks in general use. A movement has started in Montreal for the testing of the liquors sold in the licensed bars. The inspector and assistant should have, and should exercise, the right to enter any bar and carry away for analysis any bottle of liquor from which customers are being served.

It may be true that the man who drinks strong liquors habitually acts foolishly, but about half the population do it, and the State that licenses the sale of intoxicants should take the necessary steps to prevent adulteration. If conditions in this respect are not as bad as in the United States, the remedy can be applied more easily.

### HERE AND THERE.
