Now, under the postal treaty with the United States the Canadian tons of papers of this kind that reach Canada weekly free of charge, getting in return the insignificant amount represented by the circulation of Canadian periodicals abroad At a glance can be seen the disparity be tween the amount of Canadian publications that can reach the United States, for instance, and those coming into this country from that source. Not only are these American journals a source of expense to this government for carriage and delivery but are beyond the control of our Post Office Department as to contents It thus happens that they contain advertising and other matter which under the regulations to refuse, When it is known that the trade journal with its wide-spread distribution, pays the highest rate of postage exacted under on Postal Act, it will be observed under what disadvantages it carries on its work the trades it represents .- Shoe and Leather Journal.


