Give Liquor To A Minor

Martin Mason, who is a clerk in the employ of W. A. Shambroke, liquor dealer, 205 Parliament Street, was convicted in the Police Court yesterday of selling liquor to Fred McCue, a person under 21 years of age.

McCue, who gave his age as sixteen, swore that Mason sold him a quart bottle of Seagram's whiskey for 75 cents. Two other boys testified that they drank out of a bottle which McCue had. One of these boys admitted getting drunk. They could not say where McCue got it.

Mason swore positively that he had not sold a bottle of whiskey to McCue.

Magistrate Denison believed the boy in preference to the clerk and imposed a fine of \$10 and costs or 15 days.

Got Liquor After Hours.

Daniel Small, who has a liquor store at the corner of Louisa and Elizabeth Streets, was convicted by Magistrate Denison yesterday of selling a quart bottle of whiskey to Mr. McBryan after eleven o'clock p. m. A policeman testified to seeing through the shop window Small take down a bottle from a shelf, wrap it up, and hand it to McBryan. He saw McBryan hand Small something and Small go to the till and put it in. McBryan swore he had bought the bottle at noon and paid for it, and that Mr. Small had wrapped it up then and laid it aside for him. He had been delivering goods for Mr. Small, and had returned to the store after eleven, handed Mr. Small the money, \$2.40, which he had collected for him, and Mr. Small had handed him the bottle of whiskey which he had bought and paid for earlier in the day, and which was already wrapped up and laid aside.

Mr. Small gave evidence corroborating McBryan. Magistrate Denison fined Small \$20 and costs or 15 days.

The Telescope had a call from Mr. R. E. Moore of Lions Head on Friday. Mr. Moore is the chairman of the Board of license commissioners for North Bruce, and he is determined he says to make the hotel-keepers of that district keep hotels, not saloons. He has already made a tour of the district, and has notified all the holders of licenses what they must do, if they don't want to be cut off. He thinks every constable who knows of an infraction of the law and does not prosecute, should be cut of the list.
