Now that the season is on, fishermen will do well to make a note of the changes in the Fishery Regulations as they apply to the season of 1905.

No one may carry away a greater catch in number in one day than eight black bass, four maskinonge, twelve pickerel, or four lake trout. No one may catch or carry away more than thirty speckled or brook trout, or more than ten pounds in the aggregate. No black bass less than ten inches in length, pickerel less than six inches in length, or maskinonge less than thirty inches in length shall be retained but must be returned to the water uninjured. The sale and export of speckled trout, black bass and maskinonge is prohibited. The close season for trout is from Sept. 15th to April 30th inclusive, and for black bass from April 15th to June 15th.—Ex.
