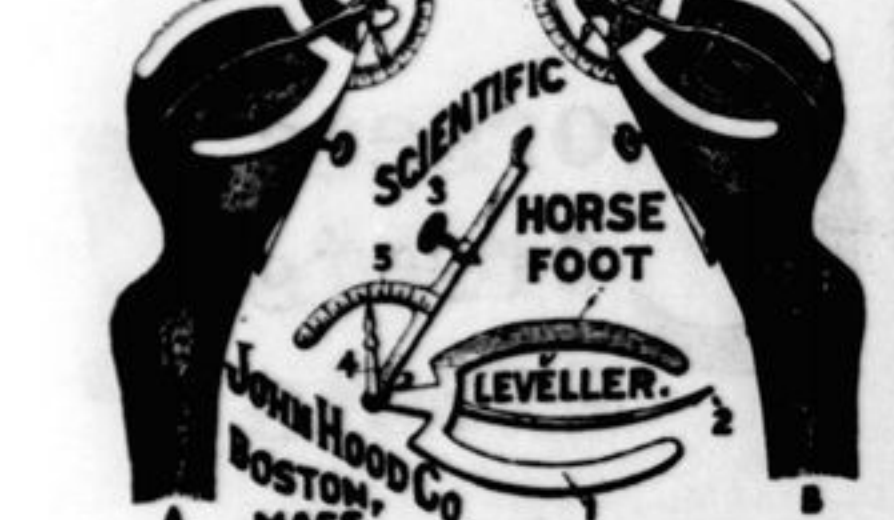

**MR. JOHN HARDY KILLED.**

Particulars of the Death of a Respected Swinton Park Resident.

On Wednesday of last week Mr. John Hardy, a very highly respected farmer of Swinton Park, was driving in his buggy to Flesherton via Ceylon, and after leaving the latter place he was overtaken by a runaway team belonging to Mr. Geo. Clark, of the east back line, Artemesia. When the team became unmanageable Mr. Clark shouted, but Mr. Hardy failed to get out of the way in time to escape the crash which completely wrecked his buggy and so terribly injured himself in the spinal column that almost total paralysis resulted. He was removed to Mr. Muir's house nearby and Dr. Bibby, of Flesherton, summoned, but he succumbed to his injuries early on Friday morning. The remains were prepared for burial, and was conveyed to his sorrowing friends to his late home. The funeral took place on Saturday to McKeechie's cemetery at Priceville, Rev. Matheson officiating. It was largely attended by those who knew Mr. Hardy as a good friend and neighbor. Deceased was forty-six years of age and leaves a wife and two children who have the sympathy of many in their heavy affliction. Mr. Clark received slight injuries and his team was considerably cut in the mix-up.—Dundalk Herald.
