### New Lacrosse Rules.

The following C. L. A. rules are worthy of the particular attention of lacrosse players in view of the bad reputation which the game has acquired:

(2) The home club in all matches shall be responsible for keeping the grounds clear of spectators and for the maintenance of good order. It shall be the duty of the referee to see, previous to the game, that proper provision is made for maintaining good order.

(3) If the spectators in any way interfere with the players or officials to delay the progress of the match the referee shall declare the match off and report the circumstances to the Executive.

I would advise the officials of the home club to ask ten or twelve of the friends of the club to assist the police in keeping the grounds clear and to use their influence in frowning down any rowdism. Good clean play should be applauded and rough play discouraged in every way.

(4) Any player striking another on the head (which means face also) shall be ruled off for a period of not less than five minutes and not more than fifteen minutes for striking with the butt end of his stick.

(5) Players must not check the goalkeeper within the crease, and goalkeepers must not strike an opponent for entering his crease. The referee must punish in both cases.

### CIRCUS MUST PAY \$500.

A by-law to provide for the issue of licenses for menageries, travelling circuses, side shows, etc., was introduced and passed at the adjourned meeting of the Town Council on Friday evening. For the information of our readers we quote the following provisions from the by-law: For a license to keep for hire or profit any instrument or mechanical device for amusement, a monthly fee of \$100 for first instrument, \$25 for each additional one.

For a license to hold or exhibit a travelling circus or menagerie, hippodrome or other like travelling exhibition, a fee of \$500, and for each side show or other entertainment connected or associated with such circus a fee of \$50; and no circus or menagerie, hippodrome or side show shall be exhibited in the town of Meaford for a longer period than one day unless by permission of the Mayor or acting head of the corporation and the chairman of Finance Committee of the Council thereof, and unless a new license is taken out for each day such exhibition or show is exhibited.

For a license to exhibit picture paintings, statuary or work of art, for each day of such exhibition, a fee of \$5.

For a license to exhibit or hire wax works, menageries, circus riding, rope walking, dancing, tumbling or other acrobatic or gymnastics, wild animals or hippodrome sparring, slight of hand, legerdemain, boxing, juggling or other like tricks, natural or artificial curiosities, tableaux, wonderful animals or freaks of nature, or any other exhibition for profit when exhibited in any building (other than a theatre, music or concert hall or other duly licensed building) tent or enclosure or in any public place for each day of exhibition, \$50.

For a license for hire or profit of any troupe or company of actors, musicians, dramatic or musical performers, where such performances is given elsewhere than in a licensed theatre, music or concert hall, building, tent or other place, for each day's performance a fee of \$25.

Any license fee imposed under this by-law may be reduced to the extent of not less than 1/3 of amount if Mayor or Chairman of Finance Committee together sign a written consent and direction to the Treasurer to receive such reduced fee and to issue a license on payment thereof.

On payment of the proper license by this by-law it is lawful for Treasurer to issue license showing the name of the person taking out the license, for what purpose the license was taken out, the fee paid and the said license signed by the Treasurer, provided that before issuing the license the Treasurer can require the applicant to present an application stating the things or objects for which license is required, and have such application referred to the constable, who shall make enquiries necessary and certify in his opinion whether the license be lawful or proper thing to be carried on in the town.

Any person convicted of a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law shall forfeit and pay at discretion of the Magistrate or Justice of Peace a penalty not over (exclusive of costs) the sum of \$50 for each offense and in default of payment of the penalty and costs forthwith, the said penalty and costs, or costs only, may be levied by distress and sale of goods and chattels of offender and in case of no distress can be committed to the common jail of Grey county for a period not exceeding 21 days, unless the penalty and cost (if any) including costs of distress and of committal and conveyance of offender to the said gaol, are sooner paid.—Meaford Mirror.
