A PRINCELY PRINTER.

H. S. H. Prince Louis of Battenberg Knows How to "Stick Type."

Dr. George Johnson, the Dominion statistician, tells a good story about H. S. H. Prince Louis of Battenberg, rear admiral of the second cruiser squadron, who has been stationed in Quebec and who opened the Industrial Fair at Toronto on 29th August.

Lord Dufferin came down to Halifax soon after being sworn into office as Governor-General to see what he could do to pacify the Anti-Unionists of the Province, then still refusing to recognize the Dominion. The officers of the army and navy, of course gave him a cordial reception, and the officers of the Royal Alfred (flagship), proposed to give a ball in his honor on board. On the morning of the ball, looking over matters to see if everything was all right, they made the discovery that they were without dance programs. That was something not to be passed over. They must have the programs. What would the young ladies do? What the young gallants? There would be a mixing up of engagements sufficient to keep gallants and ladies explaining for a fortnight. The Royal Alfred's officers would be laughed at for not knowing how to manage a "hop" on board ship.

One of the young officers was sent posthaste to get the programs printed. When he sought the printing offices, lo and behold! all were closed. It was a holiday and the printers had taken a day off. After searching through the town, the officer found

one newspaper office, the editor of which was alone grinding out an editorial for the next day's issue. On being told the nature of his mission the editor said he himself did not know one type from another—that the mystery of printing was beyond him. "Now" says the officer, "I see daylight. If we can get into the printing office I can set up the type. I am a printer by trade and between us we can get out the dilemma." The key was found. The two went upstairs to the printing office. The officer-printer took off his coat, rolled up his sleeves and "stuck type" for all he was worth. A hand press, used for "pulling proof," was utilized for printing the programs. The work was pronounced first-class. The programs were tied up secundum artem, and Prince Louis of Battenberg—for that was the printer's name—hurried on board the flagship with the precious parcel which saved the situation; and that night at the ball "all went as a marriage-bell."

Dr. Johnson recalls the impression he then received that Prince Louis was a first-class printer, and knew his trade thoroughly. Prince Louis says, "he recalls the incident perfectly." Evidently he has been proud of his feat ever since.
