Noah Bruzzo, a former lacrosse player of Mount Forest and later of Hanover, has laid aside the peaceful instruments of labor and donned the boxing gloves, and is now to be found in the company of prize fighters. We have no doubt he will make his mark on somebody, and anyone coming to him for knowledge in the art of boxing will doubtless leave Bruzzo's presence well informed, for the information will be written too plainly below his eyes. Bruzzo is only following the bent of his genius when he steps into the prize ring, as is evident by the early propensity he showed for sparring on the lacrosse field. A COMMUNICATION FROM TOP CLIFF.

EDITOR DURHAM CHRONICLE:

DEAR SIR,—For information please allow us a few inches in the Durham Chronicle for the purpose of giving a little information, more especially to the ratepayers of the township of Glenelg, as will be seen by the heading of this article that the writer is a resident.

The general cry this year throughout the whole county of Grey is "high taxes," and Glenelg is no exception. We are not going to speak in behalf of any other municipality, but the one which we are interested in and that is old Glenelg.

According to the Revised Assessment Bill for 1905 we find the assessment as follows:

Real property.....	\$616,020
Buildings.....	144,095
Business.....	3,850

Total..... \$763,965

Or in round figures one hundred thousand dollars more than in 1904. Of course the New Assessment Act demanded the raise in the valuation this year. The County Council saw fit to raise us another 100,000, making the county valuation \$100,600 dollars and it is questionable if the whole thing was put up by Auction that old Vanderbilt would look more directions than one before bidding a million dollars for the whole township taking it as it stands, residents excepted. No doubt there are some fine farms in Glenelg and some fine buildings but they are far between for we find ten inferior farms to one good one.

This year our municipal officers were under an obligation to raise \$1,000 more than in 1904 to meet all demands. \$400 of this sum goes to the County Capital more than in 1904 or our county rates this year are \$1,600. No doubt the raise in a large measure is due to the County Poor House at Markdale. Every reasonable person will admit that it was a Christian as well as a charitable act for our county officials to erect such a building as the House of Refuge for the purpose of sheltering the poor and needy depending on the public for support, but we will confine our remarks now to showing the cause of high taxes in our municipality. Glenelg is one of the unfortunate townships in the county of Grey (if not the most) for bridges. There are no less than twenty bridges on the Big Saugeen alone from Priceville to Durham. Some of these are built in the latest style and material, which necessitates the Council to make an extra levy for they are in duty bound to keep all bridges in good repair and build new ones when required. There are between 60 to 70 bridges in Glenelg all told, and we are safe in saying there is no other township in the County that can produce so many bridges.

There is only one licensed hotel in Glenelg and that at the remote north west corner at Dornoch. If we take this as a precedent to sobriety Glenelg has no need of local option.

There are some large land owners in Glenelg. The McKeechic firm of Durham has property assessed over \$12,000 and a number of others in proportion. But we don't fine many of these, however. Everybody seems to be making a living, but it is a hard way to make a living with hills, stones and swamps to contend with, and as the case may be, a house full of little ones depending on the production of the farm no matter if good or bad. The Editor complains sometimes, but it is far better to be a good Editor than to live on a poor farm, and if you doubt, Mr. Editor, take a trip to Pinnacle Hill, Scotch-town or Kingson Heights at Glenelg and you will come to the conclusion that it is better to be Editor of the Durham Chronicle than to be struggling to make a living out of these places.
