BENTINCK COUNCIL.

Council met in the Clerk's office Hanover on Friday, the 15th day of December, 1905, according to Statute. Members all present; the Reeve in the chair; Minutes of October meeting read and passed. The Reeve reported having expended \$1023.50 on new and repairs to old bridges since last meeting. The Road Commissioners reported expenditure on roads since last meeting as follows: In Division No. 1, \$74.35; No. 2, \$11.27; No. 3, \$12.25; No. 4, \$4.80. Reports ordered to be received and cheques issued. The Reeve presented his report to the Board of Health which was ordered to be received and cheques issued for the expenses of the Board amounting to \$28.00. By-law No. 7 to appoint Deputy Returning Officers and name places for holding Municipal Election for 1906 having been duly read and ordered to be passed, signed and sealed; Polling places and Deputy Returning Officers being same for last election. The following accounts were ordered to be paid: John Mitchell, printing \$75.00; John Clark Sr., storage of grader for the present winter \$1.50; Wm. Pearson refund of Statute Labor \$2.75; The Reeve and Councillor Willis \$1.75 each as com. re county line deviation; Treasurer \$5c. for postage and stationery. \$20 were granted to the Sentinck Agricultural Society. On motion action in regard to Mr. Smit's excavation was laid over for future consideration, the council not having had time to verify measurements given in McKay & Dunn's letter of 12th inst. Council adjourned.—Post.
