PREVENTION OF SMUT AND AP-PLE SCAB.

(By Prof. W. Lochhead.)

Spring is approaching and farmers will soon be planting the seed for the known that these precautions will cure for this prevalent disease. save much money.

Now, smut is very prevelent in many oat and wheat fields, and the loss to the province by this disease alone amounts every year to two or seed oats and wheat that have smut spores attached to them. These spores are so small that it is imposnaked eye.

Perhaps the simplest and most effective method that has been devised for killing these attached spores is to sprinkle the seed grain with a dilute solution of formalin, made by pouring half a pint of forma in into ten or twelve gallons of water.
