As the various Farmers' Associations of the country have been inviting the M. P.'s of their constituencies to attend some meeting to give explanation of why they voted for the additional \$1,000 salaries, Varney Association is also trying to make arrangements with Mr. Miller, but he asks that the meeting be held in Durham, and it is but a natural request. We have no idea to what extent it will be carried this spring as much negotiating is being carried on. Some say it reminds them of twenty-six years ago in respect to immigration West.
