SAID SHE WAS A NUISANCE.

Old Lady's Matrimonial Experiences and How it Ended.

(London Free Press.)

Hamburg, March 23.—Several years ago a wealthy lady, 73 years old, living in the suburb of Altona, replied to a matrimonial advertisement, and in this way made the acquaintance of a Danish merchant named Peterson, aged 45. Peterson was subsequently a frequent visitor at the fashionable villa of the old lady who always received him with great hospitality, and often supplied him with money. One day when Peterson, who was at the villa, was confronted by a lady who claimed to be his wife, he threatened suicide. There was a stirring scene, which finally ended, however, in Mrs Peterson agreeing to seek a divorce from her husband on receiving a large sum of money from the old lady. As a consequence the couple were married, and Peterson took his aged bride to Copenhagen, where he bought a villa at a cost of \$10,000. From the first day of their wedded life Peterson treated his wife with great brutality. On one occasion he handed her a rope and a loaded revolver, telling her either to shoot or hang herself, as she was a mere nuisance. When this had gone on for some time the old lady had succeeded in escaping, and found her way to Hamburg, where, after telling her story to the police, she was placed in the hospital. There she made a will, leaving everything to her niece Peterson followed his wife, but was arrested by the Hamburg police, and must now undergo trial.

Rep. by Pop. in County Councils.

To the Editor of The News: Anent the proposal of the Ontario Government to change the County Council Act, it seems to me the proposal in the bill before the Assembly is a decidedly retrograde step. The present arrangement has reduced the cost of County Council government very materially, it has reduced the evil of the sectional idea that prevailed under the old system to a minimum, and has been so satisfactory that now a change of Government has taken place there is really no demand for the change. The old cry in the time of the Ross regime has died out for the want of a "raison d'etre." The proposition to increase the number of County Councilors by about sixty per cent. means sixty per cent. increase in the cost of county government as to give each municipality a Councilor, and an additional Councilor for if the municipality has 1,000 voters, is also a weak arrangement, and in some cases will work unfairly, because it practically means that a municipality with 999 voters will be entitled to one representative and a municipality with 1,001 voters will be entitled to two representatives, and so on per 1,000 voters.

If any charge is made I would suggest that each municipality have one representative only, and that he have a vote for each 100, 200, or 300 voters in his municipality (as deemed advisable). This would give fair play all round, and be as near "rep." by "pop." as could be obtained.
