ATHLET'S SUICIDE.

Well-Known Young Montreal Man Ends Life With Revolver.

Montreal, June 17 .- (Special)-A sensational tragedy occured to day, when Charles S. McFeat, an employe of the Canadian Pacific Railway, and a young man well known in athletic Fancy Neckwear and Belts circles, blew his brains out with a revolver at 3 Prospect avenue, Westmount. McFeat was a prominent member of the Montreal Amateur Athletic Association, and took a lively interest in all kinds of clean sport.

As soon as the boat upset the woman dis appeared, but the two men held on the boat, and a party put out to their assistance

Picotte, however, was overcome by exhaustion and sank before he could be rescued.

The insurance company resisted payment on the ground that Hartford was suffering from cancer at the time he was insured. It was shown Miss McFayden. Durham visited that Hartford and his family refused to take a policy for \$1.000, and the plaintiff claimed that this showed conclusively that the deceased had no knowledge that he was suffering from cancer.
