Investigation of the Horse Industry of Ontario by the Ontario Department of Agriculture.

At the last session of the Legislature the Minister of Agriculture secured an appropriation for the purpose of making an investigation into the condition of the horse industry in the province of Ontario. This work is now being undertaken by the Department of Agriculture of Ontario and will be commenced early in Oct. The object of this investigation is to obtain information to be used in deciding as to the best policy to adopt to encourage more extensive breeding of a better class of horses.

Following are the principal points which will be considered in the course of the investigation :

(1) The number, type, quality and breeding of stallions and brood mares in the Province.

(2) What conditions have affected or are affecting the quality and number of stallions and brood mares in the various sections of the Province, and if the effect is for good whether or not the same conditions could be applied in other sections; and if the conditions have not a good effect what could be done to improve them

(3) What class of horses can most profitably be raised in different sections of the Province under the natural conditions found in those sections,

(4) The system of owning horses by a syndicate and any other plan at private ownership.

(6) Suggestions from those interested in the horse business as to what can be done to improve conditions of the horse business generally.

In order to procure this information the Province will be divided into eight districts. Two competent and expert horsemen have been selected each District by the Committee appointed for that district. 
