### A NOTABLE TEMPERANCE SERMON.

By Rev. C. Ensor Walters, London, England.

After giving out his text, "But they also have erred through wine," etc., (Isaiah xxviii, 7), Mr. Walters said, "I wanted this evening to say something concerning the evils of intemperance and a very remarkable little book which has just been published, written by Mr. Hall Caine, upon the question of drink. Through all our national history intemperance might be traced as the great barrier to moral progress. The quantity of intoxicating drink consumed per head now was much less than in the eighteenth century. Undoubtedly progress had been made in the direction of temperance. Nevertheless, the evil of intemperance is still mighty, and is still accomplishing disaster in our land. It is well that the pulpit has spoken, that the medical profession has spoken, and I, for one, thank God that a novelist has spoken

#### IS DRINK A DISEASE OR A SIN?

Mr. Hall Caine doubts whether the evil is a disease or a sin, whether the victim of intemperance is to be pitied or punished. After briefly sketching the story of Lucy Clouseade, the preacher entered on an eloquent protest against the idea that the drunkard is not responsible. Whatever may be argued concerning the law of heredity or environment, the soul is responsible to God, and nothing can explain away the fact that God gives to the individual soul personality. If everything is to be explained by heredity, the race, instead of growing more sober, would be growing more drunken. If environment plays so great a part, how is it that there are districts in England where the social conditions are good, and yet where there is more drunkenness than in the slums?

#### DRUNKENNESS THE RESULT OF SELFISHNESS AND SELF-INDULGENCE.

Mr. Walters declared emphatically that the root cause of excessive drinking is selfishness and self-indulgence. "It will be a great evil if we pity drunkards and say they are merel suffering from a disease, that they simply need a doctor. They do not. They want God, they want conversion, they want to be born again. The only remedy is the power of God." Mr. Walters added that he did not want to say anything against Homes for Inebriates, "but I have seen this, and I speak of what I do know—I have seen men and women since I have been in this Mission rescued from drink by the very arm of God, and I believe that it is the only power in the world that can rescue a man or woman. . . . John Wesley's evangel did more than all the legislation in the world to turn men sober." Cornwall, "where I spend my holidays," was mentioned as an illustration of what Methodism has done.

It has turned the most drunken county into practically the most sober. "We must have faith in the Church," urged Mr. Walters. "We have not had enough faith. When we believe the Gospel, that Christ can change heart and character and life, then we shall stem intemperance."—The British Weekly.

### HANDLING THE APPLE CROP.

By Prof. H. L. Hunt.

In commercial orcharding, the business end of the enterprise, that of marketing the crop to the best advantage, is second only in importance to that of producing fruit of the best quality.

It is in this particular that there is the greatest need for improvement at the present time. There are hundreds of apple growers who can grow first class fruit to every one who can place it on the market when and where it will bring the best price. The growers who make the most out of their apples are those who keep in touch with the best markets at home and abroad. During the shipping season these men watch the market reports daily and unless prices are satisfactory they hold their fruit until good prices prevail. The great majority, however, of those who have apples to sell wait for some buyer to come along and sell for whatever he chooses to offer, usually from fifty cents to a dollar a barrel, or a lump sum for the crop on the trees. The latter plan is nothing less than gambling in apples, and in either case the grower seldom gets one-half what his fruit is really worth, if it were properly handled.

The remedy for this state of affairs, and what is going to put the apple trade on a better business basis, is for the growers in each apple growing section to unite and form a co-operative association through which the grading, packing and marketing of the fruit may be accomplished.

During the past year a number of these associations have been formed in various parts of the Province and the prices obtained by some of them for last year's apples have made the growers enthusiastic over this method of handling the crop.

An effective co-operative association for this purpose involves the selection of an honest, wide awake business manager, and the erection of a central packing and storage house at the most convenient point for shipment. Through such an organization, boxes and barrels can be purchased wholesale to better advantage than they can be obtained by single individuals; the grower can devote his whole attention to gathering the crop at the proper season and delivering it in good condition at the central packing house; the association relieves him of all care and responsibility in grading packing and marketing; and with work in the hands of expert packers, the grade of fruit can be made uniform, and the packing can be done properly, which, in time, inspires confidence in the purchasing public. In short, the co-operative system of handling the apple crop, under proper management, assures the consumer of a better product, and realizes to the grower a greater profit.
