ASSESSMENT AND SALARIES.

The following table has been furnished us by Inspector Campbell and will likely be of interest to ratepayers in the South Grey Inspectorate and a guide to teachers, who may be desirous of engaging in any of the schools, The sections are given, the total assessment of each and the minimum salary as required by the new Regulations. This information presented in tabular form should be accessible to every one, as it is a matter that should not be concealed, nor can trustees nor teachers evade the situation inasmuch as the present Regulations force trustees to pay the amounts stated and at the same time torce teachers under penalty of losing their certificates for accept
