The Clerk was instructed to notify T. P. Engineer to make a survey on Base line. Con. 22 which he was required to do two years ago.

A grant of \$5.00 was made to The Sick Children's Hospital Toronto. Comr. Lothian reported repairs to bridge, Lot 12, Con. 14, by Chas. Mc Innis, cost \$2 50, payment received. Report adopted—Order granted.

Road divisions for 1908.—Comr. Philp.—Con. 4 to 12 included, from Proton townline to 10th sideline not included.

Comr. Lothian—Con. 13 to 22 included, from Proton townline to 10th sideline included.

Comr. Hunter—Con. 4 to 12 included, from 10th sideline included, and Cons. 1, 2, and 3 from Mt. Forest to Naismith's sideline included.

Comr. Ferguson—Cons. 13 to 22 included and from 10th sideline not included, and Cons. 1, 2, 3, from Naismith's sideline not included to Glen-ey townline.

Resolved that the following accounts be paid:— Each Deputy Returning Officer \$5 50; Clerk distributing ballots, \$4; W. J. Sharp, use of Hall, No. 10, Financial Statements, Ballots, etc., \$20.60.

Ryan—Murray—That the report from Dr. Jones, Mt. Forest, be sent back for proper dating, etc., and that the clauses of measures employed in isolating and disinfecting be more definitely explained.

The Board of Health would recommend that in future the instructions laid down by the Provincial B. of H., with regards to the disinfecting of infected buildings, be fully carried out.

Ryan—Murray—That the clerk be requested to call attention in minutes of council that Board of Health desires parents to have their children vaccinated, or in the event of its not being done by them the Board of Health will instruct the Township Medical Health Officer to do so.
