Mr. H. H. Miller, M. P., in a communication to the Mayor stated that he had procured two cannons for the town to be placed in front of that new Armory, on the condition that the town pay the freight. In a fit of patriotism, Messrs. Kinnee and Mc-Gowan thought we ought to have them, and the rest of the Council, not wishing to appear disloyal to their King, said yes too.

The next to come under the hammer was the town hall site. The Council had in the afternoon journeyed over the various sites in a body, and though all the properties had their good and bad features it was not possible to come to an agreement among the members as to which will be the choice. The McKechnie Diamond Mine on Garafraxa street was all right in some ways, but the majority seemed to think it was salted and not worth the price asked, about \$5000. The Edge and Irwin property on Mill St. was too close to the railroad for some. The combined price of these two properties was \$1200. Next in line was the W. B. Vollet property on Garafraxa St., opposite the Durham Foundry. This property can be purchased at \$10 per foot of 132 feet frontage, and has, we think, the best chance of winning out in the race.
