News of the World

Day Elmore, a Los Angeles, Cal., cigar dealer, has just broken a fast of 43 days.

A C. P. R. passenger train was wrecked near Kenora on Friday last, by running into a boulder on the track.

Geo. Flock, a parole prisoner, of Toronto, is under arrest charged with attacking a woman who conducted a store in Yonge St.

Canon Baker, a noted Anglican churchman, of Guelph, is dead, aged 81 years.

Thos. Noah, the Indian, was sentenced to 12 years in Kingston at the London assizes on Friday last on a manslaughter charge.

John Tvo, a Kingston youth, was fined \$20 for having pointed a gun at Arthur Bielly, and shooting him. The boys had fought a duel in fun.

Joseph McDonald, of Barrie, was sentenced to 2 years in the penitentiary and 20 lashes for criminal assault on three girls aged respectively two, three and five years. This is his second conviction for the same offense.

Percy Bowins, the Canadian, who was on trial at Detroit, for the murder of Cornelia Welch, was on Thursday last found not guilty.

William Ellis, 53 years of age, was killed at West Toronto near the diamond, where the C. P. R. and G. T. R. cross. The body was discovered about 8 o'clock Thursday evening.

NATURE PARADE OF DOUKS TOO MUCH FOR FORT WILLIAM.

Ten Men and Nine Women are Arrested and Then Sentenced to Six Months in Prison.

Fort William, Ont., April 9.—Six months in jail was the sentence handed out by Magistrate Palling this afternoon to 19 of the local Doukhobors, who this morning attempted to hold another parade devoid of any wearing apparel, and were stopped by the police before they got up town.

The sentence imposed by the magistrate was a lenient one, as the statutes allow him to impose as high a sentence as five years.

After the imposing of the sentence the 19 prisoners were conveyed in hacks to Port Arthur, where they will be lodged in the district jail pending their departure for Toronto.

The parade and arrests of the pilgrims this morning was very dramatic and an immense crowd of curious viewers the spectacle.

Nearly all the band are now running around the house nude, and all the police force are on duty to prevent them from attempting another parade.

The prisoners all took their arrests in a calm manner and continued their weird dirge throughout the entire proceedings.
