GLENELG COURT OF REVISION.

The Court of Revision for the Township of Glenelg for the year 1908 held first sitting on May 27. All the members present and made the necessary declarations. The Reeve was appointed to the chair. Appeals were heard and the assessment roll was changed as follows:

Reductions in assessments were made as follows:

Alpheus Murray reduced \$100, Donald McArthur reduced \$100, Geo. Leitch reduced \$100, William Weir reduced \$150, John Ritchie reduced \$200, Samuel McComb reduced \$50

Thos. Glencross was assessed for Lot 3, Con. 9, as tenant.
 Duncan Smellie was assessed for Lots 31 and 32, Con. 1, N. D. R., as tenant.

With these changes the assessment roll was passed and ordered to be certified to by the Clerk, and the Court of Revision rose.

After Court of Revision the council met for general business. All the members present, the Reeve in the chair. Minutes of last meeting read and confirmed, several communications having been read.

Hunt—Weir—That the assessment roll, as now finally revised, be the assessment roll for the year 1908 and that the Clerk certify to it as such.—Carried.

McMillan—Weir—That the Reeve and Commissioner Hunt be a committee to confer with McNally and find out the best possible condition on which a roadway can be got across Lot 5, Con. 9, and report.—Carried.

Weir—McMillan—That Orr Minnis be refunded \$10.70, be on account of error of assessment.—Carried.

Weir—McMillan—That an appropriation of \$200 for each ward be made for 1908.—Carried.

HAD THE TIME OF HIS LIFE.

O'Brien Picked Up \$985 and Spent Nearly All of it.

"I just had one swell time; the best of my life." Such was the statement made by James O'Brien (alias Kid McCoy Mulligan) when arrested last night by Detective Mackie and Anderson on the strength of a warrant from the Chief of Police at Winnipeg, charging him with the theft of \$985. O'Brien reached the city a few days ago and had been taking in the sights of York street, when the two detectives recognized him as answering the description of the man wanted in the west. O'Brien chatted freely about the case.

"I had the money all right," he said, "but I certainly did not steal it. When I stepped off a train in Winnipeg about three weeks ago I picked up a wallet containing \$985, and I considered that it was up to me to keep my mouth shut. I did so and quietly boarded the next train for Calgary. When I reached there my wardrobe did not look any too good, so I got a new suit and other things necessary to complete a well-dressed man, and then I went to Medicine Hat. My stay there was of short duration having decided to return to Winnipeg. I only remained in the latter place a few hours, and then came on to Hamilton, where I again added to my wardrobe, in the form of a handsome suit case and some jewellery."

Although O'Brien had been in the city a few days he had no particular place of abode here, and secured lodging just wherever he happened to be at night. When searched at the station a wallet and \$285 in cash were found in his pockets. O'Brien says he had been working in the bush near Winnipeg, and told the police that this was the only chance he had ever had of enjoying plenty of the world's luxuries.—Globe.
