A report by one of Great Britan's consuls in Japan shows that the "Yankees of the east" began to de velop the patent medicine business long before the United States was more than a few little Atlantic coast hamlets-that is, in the year 1682

The business had its origin at Toyama, on the west coast Its founder and patron was Prince Seiho Maeda.
