By Law Effective

The Hanover early closing by law will be rescinded at an early meeting of the council owing to improper classification. Mr. Fred Deutschman of Deutchman's Fair who did not sign the by-law and who was strenuously opposed to it, kept his store open in the face of the by-law as passed, and an action was brought by Constable Campbell acting on behalf of the merchants favoring the by-law. Magistrate Telford heard the case last Thursday. Barrister Mickle of Chesley appeared for the plaintiff and Barrister Robertson of Walkerton for the defendant. It requires 2/3 of each line of business to carry the by-law and as in the grocery classification this ratio was not secured, the case fell through. It is likely that the majority of the stores will now be open every evening except Sunday.—Hanover Post.

The special postage stamps to be issued in commemoration of the ter centenary celebration at Quebec are now ready, and will be placed on sale this week. The stamps are of the most artistic design, and are larger than the ordinary size, to allow of adequate representation of historic scenes, portraits, etc. The description of each denomination is as follows: Half cent, grey, picture of the Prince and Princess of Wales; one cent, green, portraits of Champlain and Cartier; two-cent, red, King Edward and Queen Alexandra; five-cent, blue representation of L' Habitation de Quebec; seven-cent, yellow, pictures of Montcalm and Wolfe; ten-cent, mauve, pictures of Quebec 1700; fifteen-cent, picture of the Parliament of the west of the old regime; twenty-cent, green, picture of a courier du bois with Indians.

A Close Call.

What might have been a serious accident was that which happened last week at the lime stone quarry on lot 28, concession 11. St. Vincent, when Mr Thos. Vail and John C. Callery, oldest son of Mr. W. A. Callery, Bayview, undermined about 25 tons of solid rock which caused a landslide. The men were working on a sidehill about 50 feet above the level and were breaking the limestone and loading it in a car to be taken to the kiln when the accident happened. Mr. Vail happened to pick out some small pieces of rock on the underside of the immense weight, with the result that the whole 25 tons gave way and slid down the slope. The man and boy, upon being called to by Mr. W. A. Callery who was working in the kiln some 50 feet away, were warned of their impending danger and barely had time to make their escape from instant and sure death. The large rock in its fall, lodged for a few seconds against a smaller one, enabling the frightened man and boy time to run down the hill ahead of the tremendous lump that was close at their heels. At the bottom of the slope the large rock fell upon the lime truck, which is used in taking the stone to the kiln and capable of carrying a ton, and smashed it into atoms. The men are now shaking hands with themselves to think that they made such a miraculous escape while death hovered at their very heels.—Meaford Express.

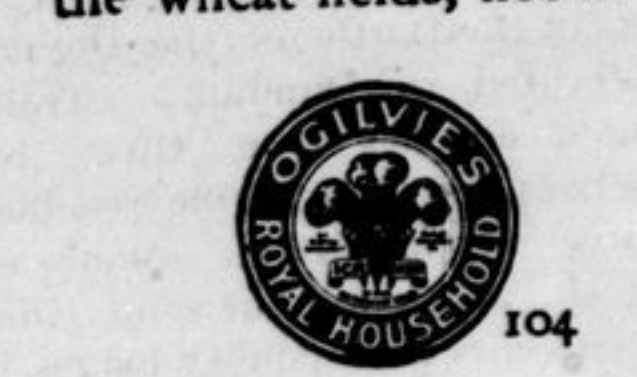

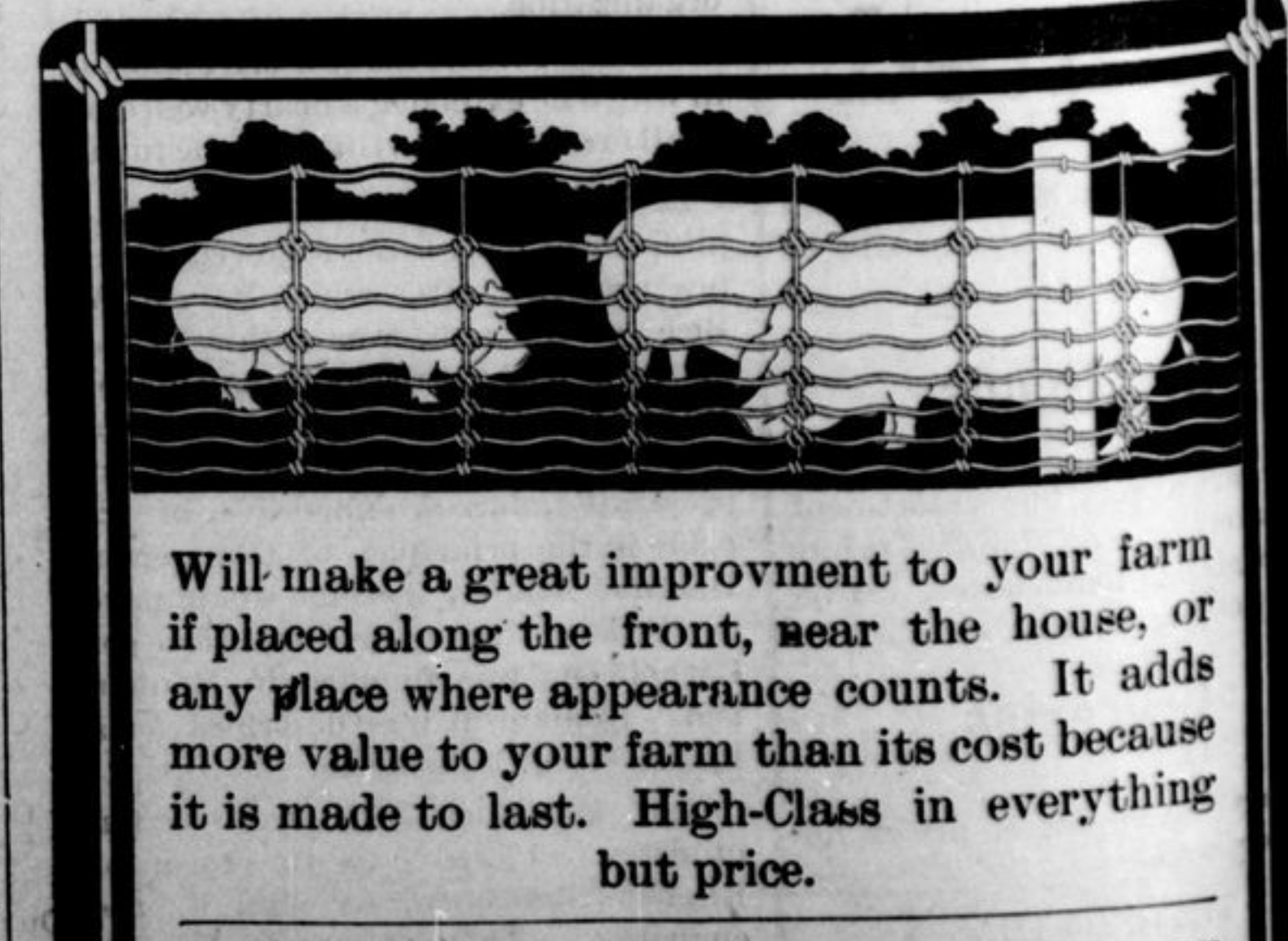
