A pacifier is a black or white rubber nipple without a hole in it. It is given to a baby "to keep him quiet" and it does. So about nine-tenths of the babies one sees, such these "pacifiers," and now it is discovered that the alarming increase of the growth of adenoids and enlarged tonsils is directly due to those supposedly harmless "pacifiers." A physician who has given more than twenty years of his life to work among children in hospital dispensary and in private work among the poor and wealthy, declares that about nine-tenths of the cases of enlargement of the tonsils and the presence of adenoid can be directly traced to the use of the "pacifier"; and the medical profession, almost as a unit, has endorsed this discovery and statement. The constant sucking of the pacifier causes the soft palate of the child to rest against the posterior wall of the mouth constantly, and this constant friction tends to produce irritation and congestion. The "pacifier" has now been absolutely abolished in children's hospitals. The discovery is an important one, since there is a question that these "pacifiers" are universally used, while it is also true that the increasing need of operations upon children for adenoids and enlarged tonsils has mystified both physicians and parents.
