The Country's Greatest Need.

What does Canada need most? was recently given as the subject for an essay by a member of a Collegiate Institute staff to the pupils in charge. The subject is well chosen. It is designed to set pupils thinking along a line calculated to prepare them for the duties of citizenship; and that should be one of the most important functions of our higher schools. The subject is deserving of consideration, too, by those long past school age. What does Canada need most?

The country needs capital for the development of its latent resources, and the labor through which this capital may be turned to profitable account. It needs husbandmen for the vacant fields, men who will make its mineral wealth available and railways to carry that which is produced to market. But above everything else, Canada needs development on the part of individual citizens of a full realization of all the duties which go with citizenship. In this is included not only the duty owing the family, but the duty to the municipality, the Province and the Dominion as well. There is involved in it diligence in business and the demand that each citizen shall keep himself fairly well informed as to the public affairs of his township, Provincial and Dominion Governments, to the end that he may, when called upon, cast an intelligent vote on affairs connected with each.

The greatest danger menacing this country is found in the existence of an ignorant and corrupt element in the electorate on the one hand, and a comparative indifference to public duty by those who are fairly well informed on the other. If every intelligent citizen could be made to realize that he is really part of the Government and to fully appreciate the duty which goes with such a privilege, there would be much greater wisdom shown in the conduct of public affairs than in the case at the present time.—Weekly Sun.
