He finally entered a region entirely destitute of moisture and lost his way. Here the pages of the diary contain entries fast becoming illegible, that read as follows:—"No water to-day. Must get over the next range to find my trail back things ahead look bad. "Can't find my trail. No water now for two days. Am about all in. Will be able to hold out through tomorrow. This is the last legible entry, although Pratt had previously scrawled fat, and left a request that notification of his death be sent to his brothers.
