An Act to Restrain the Use of To bacco by Young People.

Assented to 20th July, 1908 H's Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as

1. Every one 's gu'lty of an offence and l'able on summary conviction in the case of a first offence to a penalty not exceeding ten dallars, and in the case of a second offence to a renalty not exceeding 25 dolsubsequent offence to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dellars, who, directly, or indirectly, sells or gives or furnishes to a person under the age of sixteen wears any o'garettes or c'garette papers, whether for h's own use or not, or sells or 'g'ves or furnishes to such a preson tobacco he knows or has reason to bel'eve 's for the use of that person.

2. It shall be the duty of any constable or person having the powers of a constable, or person authorized se to do by any by-law in that behalf made by any author'ty or person having power to make such by-law, to saize any elgarettes, e garette papers or tobacco 'n any form other than c'garettes in the possession of any person apparently under the age of s'xteen years whom he finds smoking or chewing or about to smoke or chew tobacco in any street public place.

3. Every one 's guilty of an offence and l'able on summary conviction in the case of a first offence to be reprimanded, in the case of a second o'fence to a penalty not exceeding one dollar, and in the case of a third cifence to a penalty mot exceeding four dollars, who, being under the age of sixteen years, who smokes or chews tobacco 'n a street or public place, or purchases or has in possess'on, whether for h's own use or not, any c'garetites or c'garetite papers, or purchases or has in his possess'on for his own use tobacco in any form other than c'gorettes.

2. It shall be the duty of the justice to examine upon oath or affirmation all persons brought before h'm who are found gu'lty of violation of this section, as to where or from whom such persons purchased or obtained the cigarettes or cigarette paper or tobacco found in the possession of any such person; and the refusal to give such information to the sat'sfaction of the justice shall be deemed a contempt of the count. 4. If, on compaint to a justice, it

is established to his satisfaction that an automatic machine, for the sale of e:garettes, cigars or tobacco in any form, kept on any premises, is being used by persons under the age of s'xteen years, the justice may order the person on whose premises cautions to prevent it so being used as are specified in the order, or, if necessary, to remove the | machine within any specified time.
