We all join in expressing our sincere thanks to him and hope the Township will benefit by his services for many years to come.—Carried unanimously.

The Reeve and Treasurer replied.

The Council then presented the Clerk with a very flattering address, accompanied with a beautiful and costly pair of gauntlets, and assuring him that he need have no scruples in accepting, as it was the free will of the individual members of the Council.

The Clerk thanked the Council for the gift and the expressions of good will in the address just read, and stating that during the twenty-five years he had served as clerk no members of any of the Councils of that period had ever spoken an unkind word to him, and that the special mark of good feeling made manifest by the present Council makes him feel as he would like to serve them twenty-five years more.
