The correct majority is easily arrived at. If two vote against the by-law, three must vote for it, so as to keep even.

The way the Post figured out the result was by finding the total vote polled on the by-law, which is 611.

The only way the majority can be figured out as less than 26 is by counting each favorable voter, over the 351 as two thirds of a man.

CANADIAN IS CHIEF.

Son of Minister Now Leads the "Flying Rollers."

Once more the strange "Jezeelite" sect and their temple, the huge, square, windowless building on the top of Chatham Hill, North Kent, England, have claimed public attention.

The remarkable tower, which can be seen for many miles around, is inseparably connected with one of the oddest of the many strange religions which have sprung up in the country.

"Jezeel" soon gathered hundreds of credulous followers, who, as prescribed by their faith, let their hair grow long. He soon gained a considerable fortune, married a beautiful Chatham girl named Esther Rogers, and lived almost as luxuriously as the "Prophet" Dowie.

One mistake, however, was made by Jezeel. He said he would live forever. But he died, and the sect would have received a grievous setback but for the promptitude of Mrs. Jezeel, who said that, after proclaiming herself a real prophet, and three years later as Queen Esther.

Three years ago the Jezeelites were adopted by a new leader—an engineer and the son of a Canadian Nonconformist minister. He is the self-formist minister.
