Bentnick council met at Lam-lash on Monday, Feb. 7th, members all present, the reeve in the chair, minutes of last meeting read and passed.

To the municipal council of Bentnick, Gentlemen—Your committee appointed to enquire into the Treasurer's surties beg leave to report the same to be correct and satisfactory. All of which is respectfully submitted.—J.F. Dods-worth, reeve; T. Clark, auditor.

Wilson—Noble.—That the report on treasurer's surties be adopted and they be paid \$2 each for their services and the registry office be paid 75c. for search.—Carried.

The auditors presented their report, when it was moved by Robert Grierson, and seconded by W. Lunney—That the auditors' report be accepted, and they be paid their salary of \$6 each, and J.W. Vickers be paid \$6 for auditor for 1908.—Carried.

By-law No. 2, regulating the scale of statute labor, and By-law No. 4, appointing pathmasters for the current year were duly passed.

Lunney—Grierson.—That D. McKinnon be appointed an additional member of the board of health for the year 1910.—Carried.

Noble—Grierson.—That Wm. G. Hastie be appointed assessor for the township of Bentnick for 1910 at the salary of \$90.—Carried.

Wilson—Noble.—That the report of the special committee on Saug-reen jam be placed on file.—Carried.

Lunney—Noble.—That Robert Grierson and Samuel Putherbough be appointed a committee to find out and report on the probable cost of draining water from road-way on concessions 8 and 9, N.D. R.—Carried.

Wilson—Noble.—That the Municipal World be paid the sum of \$11.44 for assessor's roll and stationery, and copies of Municipal World, and cheque do issue.—Carried.

Wilson—Noble.—That George Mitchell be paid the sum of \$29.00, balance of 1909 printing account, and printing local option ballots, and cheque do issue.—Carried.

Wilson—Lunney.—That the account of Schlegel and Muter, of 25 cents for welding scraper bar be paid.—Carried.

Noble—Grierson.—That the salary of treasurer for 1909, amounting to \$100, be paid.—Carried.

Wilson—Grierson.—That J. S. Wilson be paid the sum of \$2 for preparing financial statement for 1909.—Carried.

Wilson—Grierson.—That the reeve and councillor Noble be paid \$2 each for investigating the case of Joseph Samens reported to be in destitute circumstances.—Carried.

Wilson—Grierson.—That J. S. Wilson be allowed to refund 50c. overpaid on culvert, S.L. 26, con. 4.—Carried.

Lunney—Grierson.—That a grant of \$5 be given to the Sick Children's Hospital, Toronto.—Carried.

By-law 241, to appoint an assessor passed its readings. The name of Walter A. Reeves was inserted in by-law, salary \$90.

By-law 242, to appoint collectors was passed. The name of J.C. Adams was inserted as collector for the N.D., salary \$35; and that of Wm. Horsburgh for S.D., salary \$35.

By-law 243, to enable reeve and treasurer to borrow money was passed.

By-law 244 to appoint pathmasters, was passed. The list of pathmasters will be published later.

McIlvrde—Roberts.—That an order for \$14.63 be drawn in favor of the clerk of the division court, Durham, in full for costs Egremont re Bryans suit.—Carried.

Dr Brown received \$10 for medicine re Olive Cartur as settlement in full.

Com. McIlvrde reported on Treasurer's surties, and found the present existing conditions in the Registry office on the above unchanged. Cost of search, \$1.50.

Roberts—Philp.—That report be adopted, and an order be drawn for \$1.50, cost of search, and \$1 commission in favor of Com. McIlvrde.—Carried.

Watson—McIlvrde.—That S. Robb's tender for tile making be accepted at 30c. each piece, with ring on, and John McBeth's for 8, 10, 14 inch tile at 30c., and 16, 20 and 24 in. tile at 35c., each, be accepted.—Carried.

The auditors presented their report, which was carefully examined by the council.

Philp—McIlvrde.—That the auditors report be adopted, and they receive \$10 each for their services, and 200 copies be printed for distribution.—Carried.

Resolved that the following accounts be paid: W.J. Funston, spreading gravel, on P.T. line, \$1; Municipal World, assessor's supplies, \$8.56; G.E. Hudson, printing by-laws, ballots, \$43.00; W.B. Sutton, express charges, 50c.; clerk, telephoning, 25c.

Roberts—Philp.—That we adjourn to meet on Monday, March 21st. to receive tenders for cement for tile, and for general business.—Carried.
