RABIES

The "Regulations for the prevention of rabies in man", and as approved of by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, have been adopted by the local Board of Health for the Township of Glenelg.

THEFORE, all dogs within the said Township must be either securely chained in an outhouse or other building, or kept under lock and key, or efficiently muzzled with metallic muzzles in a manner satisfactory to the Inspector of the Department of Agriculture of the Dominion of Canada, provided, however, that in case rabies is actually known to exist in said township, the muzzling privilege will be withdrawn.

Any person found violating these Regulations will (after ten days from this date) incur (such penalties as may be imposed for such offence.
