Up to the present there have been no provisions to punish corruption in local option votes, such contests having been conducted under the same law applicable to votes on municipal by-laws. ## HOUSEHOLD HELPS.

Never take a house without having the drains tested, or it may speedily overtake you.

When kerosene is spilled, the stain may be entirely removed by the application of lime-water.
