The Sun on a Rampage
Strange eruptions have appeared on the sun, according to a statement by Prof. Edwin B. Frost, director of the Yerkes Observatory at Williams Bay, Wisconsin.

"The eruptions shoot from the surface of the sun like sky rockets," said Prof. Frost. "They are easily visible at the edge of the disc. One of them shot out to a length of 150,000 miles, as near as we could estimate. It then detached itself from the main body, and sped through space, a mass of luminous gas not dissimilar to a comet. Before it had disappeared it had reached a distance from the sun of about 250,000 miles. The eruptions are probably caused by the release of pressure on some particular part of the sun."
