But the place where he will be ever in the thoughts will be in the home, for this is where sorrow comes to a focus. Those who remain to mourn his loss are his father, three sisters, Misses Ethel and Lizzie, at home, Margaret, of Owen Sound Collegiate Institute, and two brothers, John and William, at home. The funeral services were conducted by Rev. Dr. Farquharson on Monday afternoon the remains being interred in Trinity church cemetery. A funeral procession of nearly two hundred vehicles showed the esteem in which Arthur was held. The pall bearers were Messrs. T. A. Allan, A. A. Aljoe, Jas. Weir, Wm. Atkinson, Edgar Ritchie and John Firth, of Jessopville. We wish to extend our sincere sympathy with that of the community to the sorrowing ones.
