Canadian Immigration Guild.
 The prevailing dissatisfaction with existing immigration conditions, and the increasing desire on the part of employers and employees that systematic efforts shall be made to place skilled and unskilled domestic workers according to experience and capacity has resulted in the formation of the Canadian Immigration Guild.
 This association, with which all the churches and half a dozen leading Provincial organizations are co-operating, is forming a network of committees to look after the interests of the different localities—supply accurate information to headquarters as to the particular kind of domestic needed, and give other general assistance.
 From time to time, meetings of representatives will be held, where constructive policy will be decided on, and the interests of the country as well as towns provided for.
 Satisfactory arrangements have been made with influential persons in Great Britain to use their influence on behalf of the Guild. Business arrangements have also been concluded for an extensive system for collecting and sending out in charge of matrons parties of capable women and girls suited to all kinds of domestic work.
 The project has been considered by the Colonization and Agriculture Committee of the Ontario Legislature, receiving unqualified approval. The chairman, Mr. McDiarmid, is now a member of the Guild's Men's Advisory Board. The good-will and co-operation of all classes of the community are asked in furthering this enterprise.
 Australia and New Zealand are carrying out strenuous campaigns in Great Britain, assisted by free Government passages to many of the States for girls and women.
 The headquarters of the Guild are at 43 Yonge St. Arcade, Toronto, where Miss St. John Wileman, who has taken a leading part in starting the enterprise, will continue the work of organization and supervision.
