BY-LAW No. 577.

of the Municipal Corporation of the Town of Durham.

A by-law to provide for the purchase of land for a site, and for the construction and erection thereon of a market building and Town Clerk's Office, and to authorize the issue of debentures of the said Town of Durham to the amount of \$2000 for the purpose of raising the sum required therefor:

WHEREAS it is desirable to construct and erect a market building and Clerk's Office in the Town of Durham, according to the plans therefor prepared by George Kress, Esquire, and adopted by the Council of the said Town of Durham, and to raise the sum of \$2000 to be applied to the said purpose:

AND WHEREAS in order thereto it will be necessary to issue debentures of the said Town for the sum of \$2000 as hereinafter provided (which is the debt intended to be created by this By-law) the proceeds of the said debentures to be applied to the purpose aforesaid, and to no other purpose:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to issue the said debentures at one time and to make the principal of the said debt repayable by yearly instalments during the period of ten years, being the currency of the said debentures, said yearly instalments being of such respective amounts that the aggregate amount payable in each year for principal and interest in respect of said debt shall be as nearly as possible equal to the amount so payable in each of the other nine years of said period (as shown in Schedule "A" hereto annexed):

AND WHEREAS the total amount required by "The Municipal Act" to be raised annually by special rate for paying the said debt and interest as hereinafter provided is \$259.01:

AND WHEREAS the amount of the whole rateable property of the Town of Durham, according to the last revised Assessment Roll thereof is \$71,820.00:

AND WHEREAS the amount of the existing debenture debt of the said Municipality, exclusive of local improvement debt secured by special rates or assessments is \$2,122.60, and there is no part of the principal or interest of the said existing debt in arrear:

THEREFORE the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Durham, enacts as follows:

1. The Municipal Council of the said Town of Durham shall expend the sum of \$2000 in the purchase of land for a site, and in the construction and erection thereon of a market building and Clerk's Office, and for the purpose of raising the said sum, debentures of the said Town to the amount of \$2000 as aforesaid in sums of not less than \$100 each shall be issued on the first day of October, A. D., 1910, each of which debenture shall be dated on the date of the issue thereof and shall be payable within ten years thereafter at the office of the Standard Bank of Canada at the said Town of Durham:

Each of the said debentures shall be signed by the Mayor of the said Town of Durham and by the Treasurer thereof, and the Clerk of the said Town of Durham shall attach thereto the Corporate Seal of the Municipality.

THE said debentures shall bear interest at the rate of five per centum per annum, payable yearly at the said Bank at the first day of October in each and every year during the currency thereof and shall have attached to them coupons for payment of the said interest, which coupons shall be signed by the Mayor and Treasurer of the said Town of Durham:

DURING the currency of the said debentures there shall be raised annually by special rate on all the rateable property in the said Town of Durham, the sum of \$259.01 for the purpose of paying the amount due in each of the years for principal and interest in respect of the said debt (as shown in Schedule "A" hereto annexed):

THIS By-law shall take effect on and from the final passing thereof by the Municipal Council of the Town of Durham:

THE votes of the electors of the said Town of Durham shall be taken on this By-law at the following times and places, that is to say:—On Friday the second day of September next, commencing at the hour of nine o'clock in the forenoon and continuing till five o'clock of the same day, by the following deputy returning officers: In the north ward at McGrath's store by Clifton Elvidge, deputy returning officer, and in the east ward at the Town Hall by W. P. Paterson as deputy returning officer, and in the west ward at Jas. Carson's Office by John Smith as deputy returning officer:

ON Thursday the first day of September next, the Mayor of the said Town of Durham shall attend at the Clerk's Office at the said Town of Durham at the hour of ten o'clock in the forenoon, to appoint persons to attend at the various polling places aforesaid, and at the final summing up of the votes by the Clerk, on behalf of the persons interested in and promoting or opposing the passing of this By-law, respectively:

THE Clerk of the Council of the said Town of Durham shall attend at his office in the said Town of Durham at ten o'clock in the forenoon of Saturday the third day of September, A. D., 1910, to sum up the number of votes for and against this By-law. Dated at the Council Chamber

BY-LAW No. 578.

of the Municipal Corporation of the Town of Durham.

A By-law to aid and assist the Durham Furniture Company (Limited) in building and operating an extension to their present furniture factory in the Town of Durham.

WHEREAS the said Durham Furniture Company (Limited) are at present engaged in operating a furniture factory in the Town of Durham, and it is deemed advisable to enlarge and extend their present factory at the said Town of Durham.

AND WHEREAS the said Company has applied to the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Durham for aid by way of a loan to the said Company of the sum of \$20,000 in accordance with the terms and stipulations mentioned in an agreement for repayment of the said sum of \$20,000, as hereinafter set out:

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient and advisable to grant aid by way of loan of the said sum of \$20,000 to the said Durham Furniture Company (Limited) for the purpose hereinbefore mentioned:

AND WHEREAS in order thereto, it will be necessary to issue debentures of the said Town of Durham for the sum of \$20,000, as hereinafter provided (which is the amount of the debt intended to be created by this By-law) the proceeds of the said debentures to be applied to the said purpose and to no other:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to issue the said debentures at one time and to make the principal of the said debt repayable by yearly sums during the period of twenty years, being the currency of the said debentures, said yearly sums being of such respective amounts that the aggregate amount payable in each year for principal and interest shall be as nearly as possible equal to the amount so payable in each of the other nineteen years of the said period (as shown in Schedule "A" hereto annexed):

AND WHEREAS the total amount required by "The Municipal Act" to be raised annually by special rate for paying the said debt and interest, as hereinafter provided, is the sum of \$1694.85:

AND WHEREAS the amount of the whole rateable property of the said Town of Durham according to the last revised Assessment Roll thereof, is \$71,820.00:

AND WHEREAS the amount of the existing debenture debt of the said Municipality, exclusive of local improvement debts secured by special rates or assessments, is \$2,122.60, and there is no part of the principal or interest of the said existing debt in arrear:

THEREFORE the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Durham, enacts as follows:

1. It shall and may be lawful for the Municipal Council of the Town of Durham to grant aid by way of loan to "The Durham Furniture Company, (Limited)" of the sum of \$20,000 to aid the said Company in the extension and enlargement of their factory for the manufacture of furniture within the limits of the Corporation of the said Town of Durham, the said sum of \$20,000 to be repayable by the said Town of Durham to the said Town of Durham without interest in twenty equal consecutive annual instalments of \$1000 each the first instalment to become due on the first day of August A. D., 1912, and the remaining instalments on each first day of August thereafter, until the said sum of \$20,000 is fully paid, in accordance with the terms of an Agreement to be entered into between the said "The Durham Furniture Company (Limited)" and the said Town of Durham, and repayment of the said sum of \$20,000 to be secured by a Mortgage on the factory and plant of the said Company:

2. FOR the purpose of raising the said sum of \$20,000, debentures of the said Town of Durham, to the amount of \$20,000 as aforesaid in sums of not less than \$100 each, shall be issued on the first day of June, 1911, each of which debentures shall be dated on the date of the issue thereof, and shall be payable within twenty years thereafter, at the office of the Standard Bank of Canada at the Town of Durham:

the said sum of \$20,000, debentures of the said Town of Durham, to the amount of \$20,000 as aforesaid in sums of not less than \$100 each, shall be issued on the first day of June, 1911, each of which debentures shall be dated on the date of the issue thereof, and shall be payable within twenty years thereafter, at the office of the Standard Bank of Canada at the Town of Durham:

3. EACH of the said debentures shall be signed by the Mayor of the said Town of Durham and by the Treasurer thereof, and the Clerk of the said Town of Durham shall attach thereto the Corporate Seal of the Municipality:

4. THE said debentures shall bear interest at the rate of five per centum per annum payable yearly at the said Bank on the first day of June in each and every year during the currency thereof, and shall have attached to them coupons for payment of the said interest, which coupons shall be signed by the Mayor and Treasurer of the said Town of Durham:

5. DURING the currency of the said debentures, there shall be raised annually by special rate on all the rateable property in the said Town of Durham, the sum of \$1694.85 for the purpose of paying the amount due in each of the said years for principal and interest in respect of the said debt (as shown in Schedule "A" hereto annexed):

6. THIS By-law shall take effect on the day of the final passing thereof by the Municipal Council of the Town of Durham:

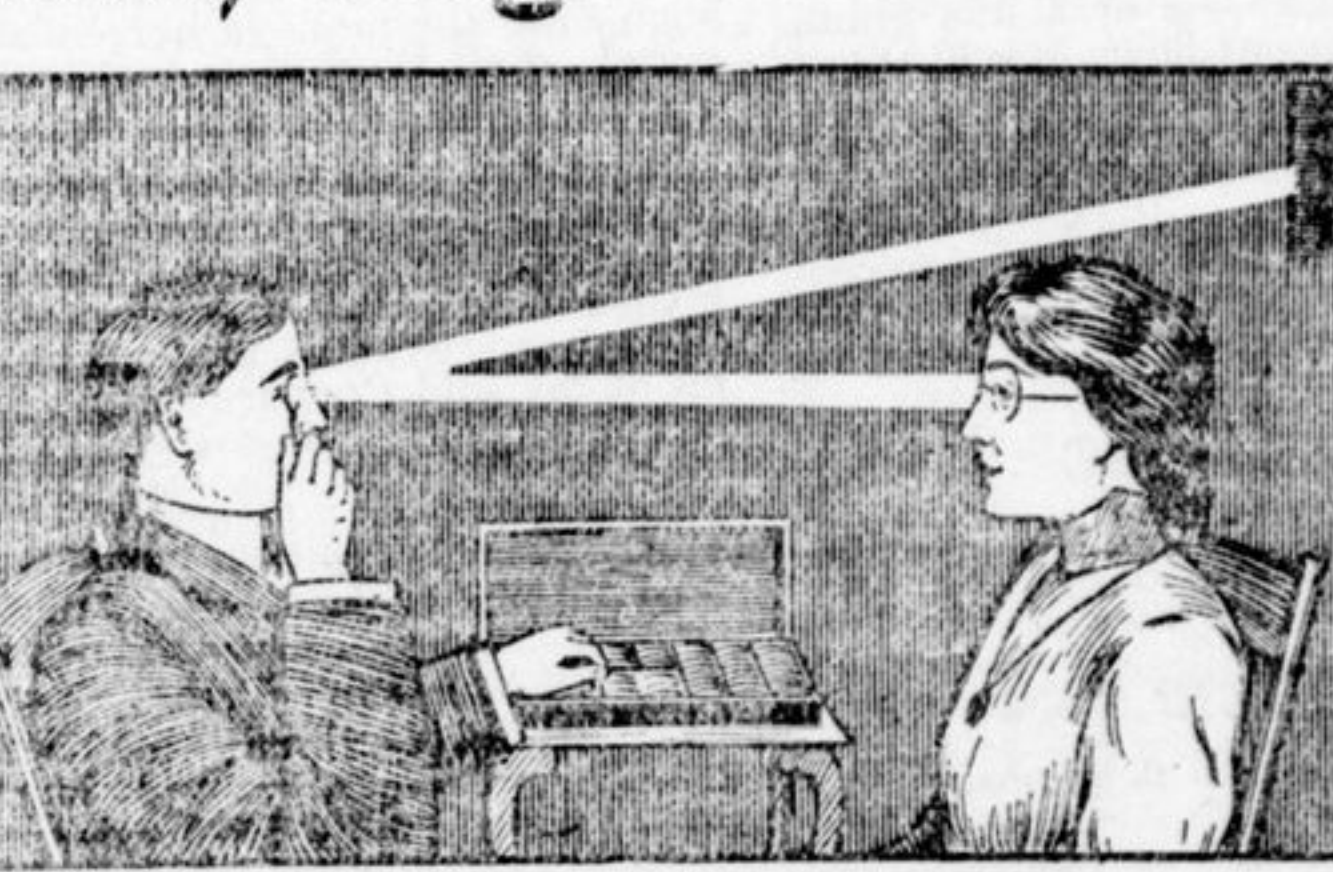
