Household Helps.

Washing tubs which are not in constant use will crack unless some water is kept in them. A few drops of lemon squeezed into the water, will make the dark cast looking potato soil white. To thicken peach jelly which otherwise remains too liquid, use one-third tart apples to two-thirds peaches.
