know just how to undertake such extensive drainage operations. The Ontario Agricultural College is endeavoring to help those in doubt about drainages. Any farmer in Ontario wishing assistance in his drainage problems, may have the same by making application to the Department of Physics, O.A.C., Guelph. As soon as possible after receipt of the application, a drainage advisor is sent to make a survey of the land, after which he makes a complete map, showing the location of the drains, the grade, size of tile, etc. When completed, the map is sent to the owner so that he has an accurate guide to follow in putting in his drains. As in previous years, the only outlay to the farmer is the necessary travelling expenses of one man in connection with the survey. The railways give a rate of a cent a mile for this work. so that the travelling expenses are

After one survey in each locality a Drainage Demonstration is held right in the field surveyed, to which all the neighbors are invited At this meeting, simple methods are demonstrated of making digging to grade, etc.

Those wishing to make application for a survey, should write the Department of Physics, O.A.C. Guelph, whereupon regular application forms will be sent.
