In order that trade should not be diverted into other channels, immedinteraction was imperative. It was not for to-morrow, he said, for this day, this hour, this minute, and his prayer to heaver was that immediate action be taken before it was too late.

Mr. Fielding was equally anxious about the transcontinental. To protect and preserve themselves, they will be forced to build roads, or require lines and connections to the south. so as to share in the inevitable north and southtrade

Similarly, the Canadian Pacific. and the Canadian Northner must build or acquire new lines and connection; to the south. The transcontinental railways will be detrimentally affected by the introduction of the reciprocity agreement. It seems impossible that it should be otherwise.


