The McArthur brothers, of Glenelg, are doing the threshing around the Lake at present. According to the request of the Review editor last Thursday night to read carefully the article that humiliated him to the very ground in the Maclean meeting, we read it, and to our mind reading it for one's self did not mitigate it in the least, from hearing it read by the speaker. But we have nothing further to say about it, more than that we obeyed the request it is by no means a valiant act to trample on a man when he is down in the dirt, even though he has wilfully placed himself there. Some newspapers are trying to mislead farmers into voting for reciprocity by carrying an advertisement from Canadian firms that they wish to buy Canadian barley in car lots at \$1.20 per bushel, providing that reciprocity carries, that is, providing it is suitable for marketing purposes. They also wished a special kind of peas in car lots, for which they would also pay from \$1.20 to \$1.40 per bushel, and be sure of getting the right kind, sent over the seed. Like the barley offer, this looked like a mighty good thing, and our farmers jumped at the offer, and have grown the peas, and threshed them too, and the yield in no case has been above five bushels per acre, which even at the big price, will leave farmers much worse off than if they had grown our Canadian peas for the Canadian market. Many of the growers have been heard to exclaim that any of those big things we have as yet got from Americans we got it in the neck, and not in the pocket. This has been a good year for curing barley, yet, by our present method of cutting it with our binders and leaving it in stook until dry enough to thresh, both Grit and Tory have admitted that of all the barley threshed in this part this year, there was only one small lot fit to use for malt, and that, through mishap, had been left uncut, until so dead ripe that it was at once picked up and taken to the barn, and by that way of doing, there was great loss on the ground. At the time of free trade, away back in the sixties, labor was easily obtained, and at about half the price of now, and grain had to be cut by hand, yet even then many farmers found it better to grow it for home use, than spend so much time trying to cure it, and so often get it colored by rain, and spoiled for the malt market. Farmers can solve many matters on which some of those city chaps are trying to mislead them, if they only take the time to think.
