THE BAD DAY SPOILS A GOOD SHOW

South Grey Agricultural Society Encounters the Dirtiest Kind of Weather.

GOOD EXHIBITS, BUT POOR ATTENDANCE

Tuesday was Ideal, but Wednesday Broke Stormy and the Gate Receipts are Away Below the Average.

The South Grey Agricultural Society held their annual exhibition here on Tuesday and Wednesday of this week. Tuesday being an ideal day, the society was jubilant over their success, but Wednesday was a bad one. A downpour of rain from early right up to the middle of the afternoon, and the rest of the afternoon threatening and showery, took the heart out of the society, who depended, to some extent, upon the gate receipts to help them out in their financial obligations.

The exhibits were good, in many lines much better than last year, and the poultry exhibits were ahead of any previous year. The bad weather spoiled a good show. The gate receipts were very small, and although inauthorized in saying so, we believe the society will suffer to a large extent financially. In sheep, swine, cattle and horses, there were a great many entries, and an extremely good showing when the state of the weather is taken into consideration.

We regret very much to report that the elements were against them, and this is not the first time they have met with such misfortunes. For a number of years the weather seems to have gone wrong on Durham's show day. It must be truly discouraging to the management, who have hoped so often, year after year, and still met with disappointment.
